## **Vocabulary and expressions:**

**The law:** The police (informal) The

**I don't know where he's at.:** I don't know where he is. **A doobie:** A marijuana joint/cigarette Here's a doobie for your walk.

**Crank:** Crank is slang for a low purity, crystallized methamphetamine that is administered in a powder form. **That's fucked up:** That's crazy.

You wanna line?/ You wanna blow some smoke?: Informal ways of asking someone if they want to take drugs.

**Labs:** Laboratories (in the film, laboratories where the illegal drug methamphetamine is manufactured).

**We'd raise that boy way better than you.:** We would bring up the boy much better than you could.



**He looked square at me:** He looked directly at me / He looked me square in the eye

**He aint from our neck of the woods:** He isn't from the same place as we are.

**To snitch:** To pass on information about someone to, for example, the police.

**To fling something:** To throw something Someone flung 'em on the porch last night.
